European Union has killed nearly ten thousand Afghans in death and torture.

The International Organization of Intelligence says that those Afghans who are sent to Europe by returning to Europe are facing serious danger and the European Union should stop this work.

The EU has a plan to release thousands of Afghans from their soil, which have not been refreshed for refugee cases.

The percentage of these people has been derived from Germany, Norway, and Sweden in the last few months.

The Amnesty International (Amnesty International) said that a number of European Union countries forced Afghans to return to Afghanistan, where there is war, human rights are going on, kidnappings and identities are emphasized every day.

A research agency of this organization, who investigated the Afghan refugees in Europe, said that European Union has implemented international standards in its own work and faced the danger of these thousands of Afghans with a serious danger at the same time. There is no peace in Afghanistan and no one can show such an area where peace is.

The International Monetary Fund's Holocaust Review Unit of Afghanistan said that the European Union should stop this work quickly, and that the European Union adopt a compulsory policy-making policy, it erodes with the soil of those Afghans to secure a peace. The area has been hit by dangerous threats to Europe and if it is transferred to your country, the situation is so insecure that they are here.

The figure shows that between the 2016 and 2016 years, the returns of the Afghans from Europe showed a high magnitude of 300% and it was from 3290 to which the figure was raised to 9460.

However, the civilian casualties in Afghanistan are also rising.

A recent UN report shows that in 2016, 11480 people were killed or injured.

Meanwhile, UNAMA shows the death rate 5234 in the first six months of 2017.
