The residents of the capital are convinced that the presence of uniforms of the unarmed armed forces in the city increased the bansom in the city.

Military analysts say government's government's failure, saying that the government is still carrying out its responsibility.

Military analyst Atiqullah Amarkhel, instead of worrying about Kabul's concerns, said that the government had to use the security force for the security of Ashura ceremonies and Shi'ite mosques.

According to Mr. Amarkhel, forces should be trained in the security threats and for terrorist attacks and attacks on the city, and use intelligence information.

Mr Amarkhel said the law enforcement agencies have taken control of the city.
